► **THE DRINK**

 You can't miss Hugo Boss's involvement in sailing: its logo is in 20ft letters on Alex Thomson's racing yacht. But The Regatta is its first serious nautical watch, with a carbon fibre dial, rubber strap and countdown function that pings once per minute; useful when your eyes are on the finish line. £475, hugoboss.com



► **THE GADGET**
 The Energy Egg watches you with sinister electric eyes, then turns off your gadgets (you hook it into a four-way splitter) when you leave the room (toilet breaks are allowed, thankfully). Clever idea – just remember to put your Sky box on another socket, or you'll be murdered by your family when it fails to record their shows...

► **THE FILM**

► **THE HOTEL**
 Country house hotels used to rely on conferences and golf to get by, but the new thing is having excellent restaurants.
